2886.PUBLIC QUESTION TIME – No members of the public present.

2887. REPORT FROM COUNTY/DISTRICT COUNCILLOR’S – No report as no District or County Councillors present.

2888. MINUTES OF THE 465th ORDINARY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 16th October 2018 were agreed as correct and signed

2889. UP-DATE RE SIGNAGE AND WHITE LINING OF C5021 – Plans agreed with Gary Warren [County Lines and Signs] are now with the SIS team in County Hall awaiting approval for funds.

2890.OTHER HIGHWAYS ISSUES – Drains, potholes and road edge erosion

Drains across private land - still awaiting up-date from Ian Case regarding the many highway and flood alleviation drains that cross private lane.

Potholes and road edge erosion– several sites have been marked in the village

2891. REPORT RE RANGER SCHEME – Agreed to continue with Ranger during the winter months to keep drains clear etc

2892. REPORT ON VILLAGE FOOTPATHS – Consultation papers received from County Council regarding all footpaths and their maintenance. From information given only Bread and Cheese Lane is on the County list for management. Both Andrew Gillard and Phil Gordon-Smith [who manage the footpaths on behalf of the Parish Council] have been asked for their input. Consultation ends on 31st January 2019.

2893. SPFA – Councillor Parsons attended the Committee Meeting held on 19th November 2018. Things are progressing well – overflow car park has been finished and is now being well used. However, there have been recent incidents of vehicles accessing the main field by driving from the Hall car park, and then along the tarmac path. It was agreed that four posts would be placed along the tarmac path to stop this. SPFA Funds have been reduced substantially on completion of the overflow car park and works carried out to the trees and hedges. Some grant monies have been received for these projects. The next projects will be the re-vamping garden area behind the Hall and then the play area. It is hoped that S106 monies from the Falcon Close development can be used in connection with the play area. Councillor Parsons advised that these monies were unlikely to be available until the Spring of 2019 at the earliest. Councillor Parsons also advised the Committee that if it was thought that any financial help would be needed from the Parish Council during 2019 this should be put in writing before the January 2019 meeting of the Parish Council. At present there are no plans in place for fund raising within the villages.

2894. COMMUNITY SHOP – Christmas stock is now in. Still hopeful that more villagers will start to use the Shop/Cafe.
